

NAPA VALLEY VINTAGE REPORT: WINTER 2021



Winter is a time of recovery and hope in the valley. We received much more than our normal amount of rainfall in the October/ November time frame, raising our hopes that the severe drought that we've been experiencing might come to an end. The rainfall was plenty to get our cover crops off to a great start, as we work to constantly improve the health of our soils. A dry December and January has us concerned, but there is still plenty of time for more beneficial storms to come through the valley. Pruning has begun, and we are seeing signs of the vines waking up, as sap flows from the fresh pruning cuts. As our climate changes, we really don't know what to expect from the coming spring and summer. We can only hope for a frost free spring, and a summer without any significant, damaging heat waves. Being in cooler parts of the valley, both Arrow&Branch vineyards are less vulnerable to very high temperatures than vineyards in the more northern parts of the valley. We have been on a vintage roller coaster for the past several years, and can only hope for a repeat of the great growing conditions that we had in 2021.

TROPHY HIGHLIGHT: 1792 Washington Getz Pattern

CERTIFIED BY THE NUMISMATIC GUARANTEE CORPORATION AS MINT STATE 63 BROWN Washingtonian Specimen Design by Peter Getz was Proposed to be the First Coinage of the United States of America



Approximate Value: \$197,500

This extremely important specimen was coined by Peter Getz of Lancaster, Pennsylvania between January 12 and March 27, 1792, to meet the statutory requirements of the never-passed Senate version of the Mint Act of 1792. The Senate version of the bill stated the coin should include in its design "An impression of representation of the head of the President of the United States for the time being, with an inscription which shall express the initial of first letter of his Christian or first name and his surname at length, the succession of the presidency numerically, and the year of the coinage." President George Washington strongly opposed the idea that presidents should be treated as kings and ultimately signed the House version of the bill which stated that American coins should depict "an impression emblematic of Liberty."

Although this design was never used for official U.S. coinage, it represents the birth of the United States economic system and the legacy of our first president. As such, the 1792 Washington Getz Pattern is a highly coveted historical artifact. This coin that our family owns has a pedigree that can be traced to T Harrison Garrett (1883) and Johns Hopkins University, among others.





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
